CONNECT EVENT SUCCESS REPORT

In novative EDUCATION FOR ALL

Introduction

InEd:Connect is a South Florida event designed to connect families with innovative education solutions in their area. This pilot event was held on June 24, 2023.

InEd Connect was designed as a unique event that brings together families and innovative educators in our area. We believe that every child deserves access to a quality education, and our mission is to provide families with the knowledge and resources they need to make the best decisions for their children.

InEd Connect offered 30 edupreneurs, educational funding information and 6 speakers to provide information about education choice and options for families. Through this event, parents connected with microschools, homeschool pods, and STEM programs to determine which option best suits their child's learning style.

Speakers shared on how looking at education differently, homeschool and innovative education options, the changing landscape of school choice, funding choices, preparing students with nuerodiversities for the 21st century, edfuturism and preparing our students for an unknown future, and innovating for some of the most vulnerable student populations.

InEd:Connect opened a resources of option for customizing a child's education. Homeschooling is a very individualized thing. Whether a parent is looking for curriculum, online programs, hybrid option, STEM, sports, art of microschool option, InEd:Connect offered a diverse look at what is available locally,

In Florida, homeschooling is loosely regulated. There are no educational or certification requirements for teachers, no list of required subjects, and no set schedule or required number of hours students have to spend learning. Students do have to be evaluated by a certified teacher every year, either by taking a standardized test or submitting a portfolio for review. The event saw about 60% of attendees exploring what school outside the traditional schooling system could look like.

The Results

According to the 2022 research, there are 56.3 million active students in the U.S.

- 86.58% of students between the ages of 5 and 18 are educated in public schools. (b)
- 8.29% attend private schools. (b)
- 6.66% of students receive education at home or through microschools/pods (approximately 3,7 million children) (b)
- The number of homeschooled students across the country has jumped from 2.5 million in 2019 to 3.7 million today. Throughout Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach and Monroe counties, nearly 8,000 students switched to homeschooling during the pandemic and haven't returned to traditional schools, according to public records obtained and analyzed by WLRN. (c)



Changes in South Florida Education

Homeschoolers and families choosing to look at education differently, today, make up between 3 and 4% of the total student population in Broward and Palm Beach Counties. In Miami-Dade, the homeschool number used to be under 1%, and now it's closer to 2%. While these percentages may seem small, they represent a significant number of students, as South Florida is home to some of the largest school districts in the country. In total, there are now more than 22,000 homeschooled students in the three largest counties.

How is education changing?

While the public schooling vs. homeschool debate has long prevailed, a shift is evident as more parents are opting for homeschooling, leading to a significant increase in students withdrawn from traditional public schools.



As of February 2020, a total of at least 9 million of current US students had been homeschooled at least one time during their educational journey (a)

Other Statistics (b)

- 80.3% of U.S. parents who homeschool their children said their main reason to do it is their concern over safety, drugs, and negative peer pressure.
- 78% percent of peer-reviewed studies on academic achievement show that homeschooled students perform better than those in institutional schools.
- 4.7% of homeschooled students live in rural areas.
- 16.2% of parents who homeschool their children have annual incomes less than \$50,000.
- The number of black families increased more than fivefold between 2020 and 2021.
- 66.7% of homeschooled students graduate from college.

Conclusion

We celebrate the remarkable success of the 1st InEd:Connect event, This event, united over 650 attendees and ignited a passion for educational innovation. We will relentlessly pursue our goals, empowering parents and entrepreneurs to shape the future of education and provide transformative options for every family.
